Use this quick check to assess your building's health:

Excessive Movement

Doors sticking? Equipment vibrating more than usual?

→ Even subtle movement can impact precision environments like ORs and imaging suites.

Settlement

Cracks in walls, sloping floors, gaps around windows?

→ Gradual shifting can lead to structural strain and ongoing operational disruptions.

Exposed Rebar

Chipped concrete revealing rust-colored steel?

→ Once exposed, internal reinforcement can corrode and weaken critical elements.

Concrete Spalling

Flaking surfaces or pieces of concrete breaking off?

→ Often an early warning sign of deeper structural deterioration—and a potential safety hazard.

Corrosion in Metal Elements

Rust on supports, railings, or mechanical systems?

→ Corrosion reduces durability and can compromise long-term system performance.

Roof Leaks

Ceiling stains, dripping water, or recurring damp spots?

→ Water intrusion can disrupt care, damage equipment, and create infection control risks.

Nearby Construction Activity

New development or heavy construction next door?

→ External vibrations and ground changes can impact your facility, often without immediate visibility.
